Introduction



Lake Technical Center (LTC) is an integral part of the community it serves. As such, LTC shares many of the same interests and problems, including concerns about crime. The institution and its available satellite sites experience many of the same risks and threats as

the community in which they are located. We are vitally concerned about the safety and well-being of our students, staff, and all visitors who participate in the many activities which we sponsor.

Although LTC has not experienced a significant number of criminal acts or safety concerns, everyone should be aware of potential problems. We encourage you to join the effort to make LTC a safe and secure environment for everyone.

Campus Safety and Security - Policies and Procedures

It is the policy of LTC that all reasonable measures shall be taken to protect students, employees, and visitors. It is expected that all faculty, staff, and students will act in a safe manner and report any unsafe condition or dangerous situation. The school will not tolerate any type of disruptive or inappropriate behavior that interferes with the primary educational mission of LTC, or creates a threat to any person or property. We take a pro-active stance on safety and security matters and sponsor programs to encourage an awareness of safety and security hazards. Emergency policies and procedures are located in each classroom and are readily accessible to students and staff. Lake County Schools are a "drug-free zone." The use of alcohol and controlled substances is prohibited. The School Board policy and Policies and Procedures Manual clearly delineate this policy.

Policies on crime prevention, campus security, and alcohol and drug prohibition are included in the Policies and Procedures Manual and school catalog which are available to all students and staff. This material is covered annually in student and staff orientation sessions. LTC complies with state and federal laws which prohibit the sale, use or possession of alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, or weapons on campus. We cooperate fully with authorities in the enforcement of civil laws.

Safety and Security - Everyone's Concern

Cooperation and involvement of every member of the school is absolutely necessary to ensure maximum safety and security. All persons must assume responsibility for their own safety and security of personal belongings. No security plan can attain maximum effectiveness unless everyone contributes to making it work. The following is a list of a few common sense precautions for your safety and security:

- Never leave your purse or valuables unattended, even for a brief moment. An all too common theft report describes the incident in which a student or employee leaves belongings unattended on a library, cafeteria, or classroom table, or on a desk for just a second and they are stolen. Secure valuables whenever possible.
- Always lock your car.
- Be patient when leaving the parking lots after class. Accidents may occur either in the parking lot or in the intersections of main streets surrounding LTC.
- Be sure to mark or label all property. Keep your books with you or properly secured at all times.

If you are on campus at night take the following precautions:

- Always walk with at least one other person to your class, parking lot or remote campus location.
- Avoid working in a classroom or isolated location at night.
- Never walk through unlighted areas of the campus. Choose the most lighted pathway.

- Park in a location closest to your last class.
- Do not engage in any activity that might cause you harm, endanger another person or school property.
- If you are a victim, intended victim, or a witness to a crime, report it immediately to your program instructor or any administrator on duty. Be alert to your surroundings at all times, and if you see anything suspicious or out of the ordinary, notify administration immediately.
- If you witness a crime or are a victim and call administration, please be prepared to provide the following information:

1. Your name
2. Quick description of any injury
3. Location of the incident you are reporting
4. Description of the scene
5. Description of any possible suspects
6. Description of the vehicles involved (if any) and a license number

Become an involved and alert student. Your ideas, comments and contributions to our safety and security efforts are encouraged and welcomed. Remember, we are always looking for ways to ensure that LTC is a safe, secure, and healthy place to work and study. We challenge you to make this a personal objective while here.



Your Right to Know

The 1990 Federal Campus Security Act requires that all postsecondary institutions make available crime statistics and security measures. In addition to the information contained in this publication, the criminal statistics have been compiled for the period January 1, 2006 through December 31, 2008. These statistics are kept on a year-round basis.
